The project includes 64 assisted living apartments, along with a special, 32-unit memory care wing, designed for seniors experiencing any stage of memory loss impairment, including dementia and Alzheimer's disease.

Enhanced Care services will also be offered, enabling Assisted Living and Memory Care residents to receive more specialized services as their needs change, while aging in place in their existing suites.

# Newsweek Best Nursing Homes 2021 List

For the 2nd year in a row, Newsweek and research firm Statista teamed up to compile a list of the top Nursing Homes throughout the country. The 5-Star rated Brothers of Mercy finished in the top 2% (ranked #14 out of 620 Nursing Homes & Skilled Nursing Facilities) in New York State.



Newsweek and Statista designed a system that evaluated nursing homes using data from 2 sources: 1. Recommendations from medical experts (nurses, administrators, therapists and physicians), and 2. Nursing Home performance based on CMS data in three domains (health inspections, staffing, and quality measures). This is the 2nd year that Newsweek has published the list.



# Walk Like a Penguin to Avoid a Fall This Winter

Falls are one of the most common injuries sustained during the winter months. Although every fall does not lead to a broken bone, strains and sprains, bruising and pain are common afterward. There are a few tips we could all use, no matter your age, to keep yourself safe as Buffalo transitions into a winter wonderland.

First, plan ahead and give yourself extra time to get to your destination. Moving quickly on ice or slushy snow is a recipe for disaster, so slow down! Make sure your footwear is in good condition. If you notice the tread wearing away on your boots or

shoes, it is time for a new pair. Try to avoid boots or shoes with heels while walking outside. Take advantage of handrails when negotiating stairs, as this is a common place for ice to collect.

At your own home, make sure walkways are clear and salted. Lastly, we can look to penguins for guidance on how to walk on slippery surfaces: short, shuffled, flat-footed steps, bending forward slightly at the waist. It's perfectly okay to waddle your way from one place to the next to keep from falling!

Operation "Lifting Spirits" is an extension of the original idea and mission - to spread hope and joy throughout the Brothers of Mercy Campus. Participants purchased "care packages" that consisted of poinsettias, Christmas cookies, or a combination of both. Many of the gifts were given to an anonymous resident - a real testament of genuine charity.

"Our goal was to have 100 care packages distributed throughout the campus. Like the "Lifting Spirits" day back in May, the response was above and beyond our expectation. 126 packages were distributed to very happy patients and residents. The continued support from friends, family members and BOM staff members ceases to amaze me", said Foundation Director Nancy Gugino.

# History of the Sacred Heart Home

In 1950, the Brothers purchased 126 acres of farmland in Clarence, NY, which would eventually evolve into today's "Brothers of Mercy Wellness Campus". The Sacred Heart Home was the original Skilled Nursing building.

In 1951, ground was broken on the first wing of Sacred Heart Home, which served 36 male patients at that time.



In 1963, Sacred Heart Home added a South Wing and new Chapel to the facility. At a cost of \$1.3 million, the expansion added 56 beds (going from 36 to 92) to the facility.

In summer 2020, the new Memory Care and Enhanced Assisted Living community will add another level of care to the Clarence Wellness Campus. The new building will retain the Sacred Heart Home name, honoring all those that worked and lived in our first building.


People came from all over Western New York to see why the Brothers of Mercy is such a special place to work.


